### Commissioner Morrissey Admires Fine Young Local Athlete—Norrinstown First, Bethlehem Second, Allentown Third—Finals at Bucknell Next Saturday

Norrinstown High won the track and field meet of the First Division of the Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic Union on Muhlenberg Field yesterday. Bethlehem was second, and Allentown third.

There was in attendance nearly five hundred young high school athletes from Eastern Pennsylvania, who were guests of Muhlenberg College, whose part in the meet was attended to by Albert Utz.

The winners will go to Bucknell next Saturday to compete for the State championship with the victors of the seven other districts of Pennsylvania, in each of which a similar meet was held yesterday, same as on Muhlenberg Field.

The affair was superintended by Peter J. Morrissey, of Bethlehem, as A. A. U. Commissioner of the Lehigh Valley. Sam Dallas, of Philadelphia State Commissioner found it impossible to be here and Mr. Morrissey carried the meet through. The schedule was heavy and some of the young contestants did not see it out to a finish.
