## Dick Belyea Runs Fastest Half Mile in Pennsylvania Schoolboy History

WEST CHESTER, Pa., May 22.—Thirteen records were broken and another equaled this afternoon on Wayne Field as Norristown outscored last year's Class A champion, Lower Merion, and Ridley Park replaced the 1936 Class B king, Prospect Park, in the P. I. A. A. District One track and field title meet.

The most sensational record-shattering performance was turned in by Dick Belyea. The Upper Darby High School junior won the half-mile in 1:57.4, the fastest time ever run by a schoolboy in this State.

In the high jump, Bob Burnett, a Media Negro, leaped 6 feet, 2 inches to set a new record. Lansdowne's unbeaten speed king, Fred Wetzel, won the 100-yard dash in 10 seconds to equal the old mark. But his work and that of Belyea and Burnett could not keep Norristown, which snared two firsts, from winning the Class A crown.

The Eagles tallied 41½ points. The other scorers were Lower Merion, 39; Upper Darby, 24; West Chester, 19; Lansdowne, 18; Lansdale, 17; Abington, 13½; Conshohocken, 12; Chester, 6; Haverford, 6; Cheltenham, 4, and Coatesville, 2.

Ridley Park, the recently crowned Delaware county champion, had little trouble winning the Class B title. It won four firsts and collected 43 points. The other scorers were Ambler, 31; Sellersville-Perkasie, 24; Collingdale, 13; Glen Nor, 12; Radnor, 11; Springfield (Del. Co.), 11; Prospect Park, 6½; Kennett Square, 6; Langhorne-Middletown, 6; Nether Providence, 5; Swarthmore, 5; Quakertown, 4; Hatboro, 3; Bensalem, 2; Downingtown, 2, and Yeadon, 2.

a record of 77 1/2 points out of a possible 80. In previous meets he actually skidded to a tie for first against N. Y. U. and a second against Pitt in the javelin.

The Owls captured no less than 11 places out of the 15 event program and would have made the accounting one sided had it not been for the tenacity with which the Kelly Greens hung on in the placing positions.

In only one event, the mile run, did the New Yorkers display their reputed prowess. Joe Moclair, Gene Kelly and Paul Dee ran away from Cherry and White opposition in this test to finish in that order in the time of 4 minutes 31.6 seconds.

This sweep, occurring in the third event, enabled the Jaspers to assume the lead to which they clung desperately until the winners regained the prime position in the high jump, the seventh event.

**Manhattan Again Braces**  
 Manhattan rallied again to stalemate the accounting at 45 all due to Lou Burns' triumph in the 880 in 1 minute 59.5 seconds plus the second place of his mate, Howard Borck. The Owls got out in front again on Peacock's 220 win, and were never headed thereafter, sewing up the meet before the hammer throw, the final event, got under way.

Manhattan's Borck came back to score the final individual track victory for his team when he bested Art Ness, of Temple, in a great straightaway duel in the quarter-mile. It looked like the Jaspers were going to score also in the two-mile grind, but Walt Nachoney, ace Owl distance runner, caught Bob Conkling, of Manhattan, at the final turn and beat him to the tape by two yards in a driving finish.

The Owls were practically invincible in the field events and also extended their domination to the timber topping track events. Besides Peacock's pair of field triumphs and Threadgill's singleton, Larry Cohen came through with a shot put win with a throw of 47 feet, while Howard Jensen and Al Swan tied for prime honors in the pole vault at 12 feet.

Cohen added a second place to his total when he trailed Howard Wheeler, of Manhattan, in the hammer throw on a whirl of 147 ft. 4 inches. The loss registered a new Temple record, beating the previous mark of 132 feet 6 inches made by Cohen this year. Wheeler's effort, eight inches better, earned the fourth and final first place for the Jaspers.

# Honors in Class A and Parkers Annex B Crown

Lower Merion, Dethroned Champion, Second in Top Division; Ambler Trails Ridley Park. Dick Belyea, Upper Darby Sensation, Runs Record 880 to Defeat Gene Borrelli. Dick Milbourne Tabs Lone Local Victory in Broad Jump. Other County Teams Outclassed. 1937 *and 1*

West Chester High, victorious in only one event, finished fourth in Class A competition of the sixth annual District One, Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic Association, track and field meet, at Wayne Field, here, Saturday afternoon.

The championship of the District in Class A went to Norristown High's well-balanced team with its total of 41½ points. Lower Merion High, defending champion, was deposed by a margin of two and one-half points, its final total being 39. Upper Darby finished third with 24 points and West Chester fourth with 19.

Ridley Park, which competed in Class A in every previous District meet, was a stand out in its new alignment in a Class B team. Its total of 43 points gave it championship honors by a safe margin of 12 points. Ambler finished in second place with 31 points, Sellersville-Perkasie, a surprising newcomer, third with 24 and Collingdale fourth with 13.

Records Tumble  
Many record performances were turned in during the course of the meet but not all of them were accepted. Because of a strong wind, blowing out of the west, records established over the straightway, in dash and hurdle events, were ruled out by the officials.

Despite this ruling a total of three new marks were set in Class A events and seven in Class B.

**Milbourne Wins**  
West Chester's lone winner in the meet was Dick Milbourne, colored sprint and broad jump ace. It was scored in the broad jump, which Milbourne won with a leap of 22 feet, 11 inches, just one inch and three-eighths short of the District record. Milbourne ran third in the century and third in the 220.

**Sensational 880**  
True to expectations the 880-yard run offered one of the most sensational record performances of the meet. In this the race lay between Dick Belyea, classy Upper Darby middle distance speedster, and Gene Borrelli, the fastest half-miler in the history of West Chester High. Both are Juniors.

Belyea was the winner, but in order to win he had to set a pace which established a new District standard for the distance and bettered the State mark by nearly two seconds. Borrelli finished about 10 yards behind the Upper Darby flash. Belyea's time for the event was 1 minute, 57.4 seconds. The previous District mark was 2 minutes, 1.8 seconds and the State record is 1 minute, 59.8 seconds.

**New Relay Mark**  
Belyea assisted in setting another record when he ran the third leg of the mile relay for Upper Darby, an event which was clicked off in 3 minutes, 30.6 seconds. Ambrogi led off for Upland quintet, Burnley ran second, Belyea third, and Dick Huebner the anchor lap.

West Chester gave Upper Darby stiff competition over three laps of the route but lost ground rapidly on the anchor leg and finished in third place behind Norristown.

In winning Class A title, honors, Norristown took first place in the pole vault, shot put and javelin throw and tied for first in a record-breaking high jump. Tom McKinney, of Norristown, matched Bob Burnett, of Media, with a leap of 6 feet, 2 inches in the high jump. This added almost three inches to the old record of 3 feet, 11½ inches. McKinney also won the javelin throw for Norristown.

West Chester's lone winner in the meet was Dick Milbourne, colored sprint and broad jump ace. It was scored in the broad jump, which Milbourne won—with a leap of 22 feet 3 1/2 inches, just one-inch and three-eighths short of the District record. Milbourne ran third in the century and third in the 200.

True to expectations the 880-yard run offered one of the most sensational record performances of the meet. In this the race lay between Dick Belyea, classy Upper Darby middle distance speedster, and Gene Borrelli, the fastest half-miler in the history of West Chester High. Both are Juniors.

Belyea was the winner, but in order to win he had to set a pace which established a new District standard for the distance and bettered the State mark by nearly two seconds. Borrelli finished about 10 yards behind the Upper Darby flash. Belyea's time for the event was 1 minute, 57.4 seconds. The previous District mark was 2 minutes, 1.8 seconds and the State record is 1 minute, 59.8 seconds.

Belyea assisted in setting another record when he ran the third leg of the mile relay for Upper Darby, an event which was clocked off in 3 minutes, 30.6 seconds. Ambrogi led off for Uplidah quintet, Burnley ran second, Belyea third and Dick Huebner the anchor lap.

West Chester gave Upper Darby stiff competition over three laps of the route but lost ground rapidly on the anchor leg and finished in third place behind Norrisstown.

In winning Class A title honors, Norrisstown took first place in the pole vault, shot put and javelin throw and tied for first in a record-breaking high jump. Tom McKinney, of Norrisstown, matched Bob Burnett, of Media, with a leap of 6 feet, 2 inches in the high jump. This added almost three inches to the old record of 5 feet, 11 1/2 inches. McKinney also won the javelin throw for Norrisstown.

The most thrilling race of the afternoon was the Class A mile, in which Irvin Kennedy, of Haverford, and Jim Wiggins, of Lower Merion, breasted the tape in a "photo" finish. The judges picked Kennedy as the winner, but the finish was so close that no one could tell who came out on top until the official decision was announced. The time for the mile was 4 minutes, 41.3 seconds.

The outstanding performance of the afternoon in Class B was that of Dunbar Pauling, of Collingdale High, in winning the 440-yard run. Pauling circled the oval in 51.7 seconds, setting a new District mark and bettering the State record for the Class B 440.

Frank Clark, Coach Harold I. Zimmerman's weight ace, gave West Chester second place points in the shot put and was the only Garnet and White individual athlete, other than Milbourne and Borrelli, who contributed to the local total.

West Chester was the only county team among the leaders in either District. Coatesville scored but two points in Class A and Downingtown picked up only 2 in Class B. Kennett Square High, thanks to Albert Grady, was the high county team in Class B with its total of 6 points. Grady finished third in the 220-yard dash and in the same spot in the 440-yard run.
