One of the most one-sided wins In the history of the event was scored in the annual P. I. A. A. District One Junior High School track championship meet at Roosevelt Field, Saturday, as an unbeaten Lower Merion squad rolled up 80 points to retain its crown by a margin of 37 points.

Winning 11 of the 16 events, the crack Main Line team, which has averaged 84 1-2 points in six dual triumphs this season, had everything its own way. Upper Darby was a poor runner-up with 43 points, while Rittenhouse was: third with 27 . West Chester nosed out Stewart, 22 1-2 to 22; Smedley tallied 21, Haverford $141-2$ and Pottstown 9.

New Records
Two new records were stablished and another equalled. Bob Settle of Rittenhouse and Bill Miller of Haverford set a pole vault mark of 10 feet 13-4 inches, and Lower Marion's 115 -pound 440 -yard relay quartet established a record of 49.1. Lower Marion's 440 -yard open relay team tied a former record of 47.5.
