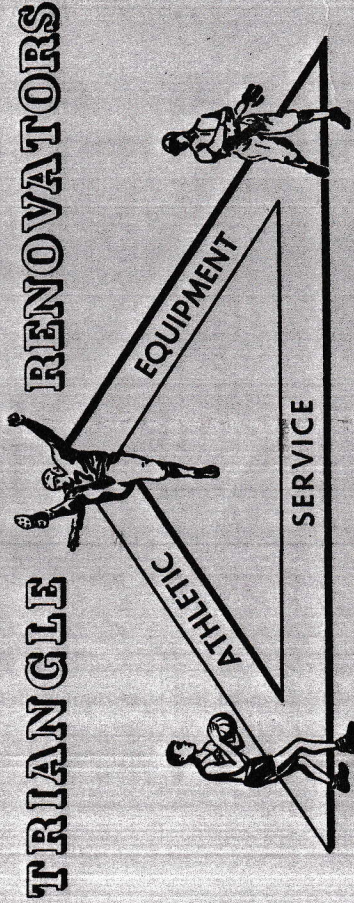

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. This District Track Meet is being held under the jurisdiction of the Board of Control, P.I.A.A. All contestants must meet P.I.A.A. eligibility rules. Events, conditions, etc. are governed by N.C.A.A. rules.
2. Class A schools are those whose total enrollment (boys and girls) in grades 9 to 12, inclusive, on October 1, 1948, was 500 or more; Class B schools are those with enrollments under 500 in the same grades on the same date.
3. No school will be permitted more than **three** participants in any event with the exception of the relay race. In the 100-yard dash, the 220-yard dash, and the hurdle events, each school will be limited to two contestants in each event.
4. No contestant may participate in more than **three** events.
5. No post entries, changes in entry lists, or substitutions will be allowed.
6. There shall be no semi-finals in track events. Trial heats will be necessary in certain events, but in the 440, 880, the mile, and both relays, only finals will be held. If there are too many contestants for one heat in these events, they will be run against time, each main place winner being timed.
7. In the 200-yard low hurdles for Class A, the first hurdle shall be placed 18 yards from the start and the remaining hurdles at 18-yard intervals. The distance from the last hurdle to the finish shall be 20 yards.
8. In the 200-yard low hurdles for Class B, the first hurdle shall be placed 18 yards from the start and the remaining hurdles at 18-yard intervals. The distance from the last hurdle to the finish shall be 20 yards.
9. In the 120-yard high hurdles for Class A, 10 hurdles, 39 inches high, will be used. The first hurdle is 15 yards from the starting line. Each of the hurdles will be 10 yards apart, leaving 15 yards between the last hurdle and the finish.
10. In the one-mile relay for Classes A and B, each contestant shall run one-quarter of the mile. In the half-mile relay, each contestant shall run 220 yards.
11. The weights of the shot used in the P.I.A.A. meets shall be 12 pounds. The discus and javelin shall conform to N.C.A.A. standards.
12. Five places will be scored in each event on a 5-4-3-2-1 basis. Gold, silver, and bronze medals will be awarded to the winners of first, second, and third places in each event. Trophies will be presented to the school winning the highest total number of points in each class. Medals and prizes will be distributed to winners from a stand erected on the field.
13. The preliminaries will begin at 10:00 a.m. (daylight time). Finals will begin at 2:00 p.m. The District Committee desires the meet to be run off without unnecessary delays. Contestants will therefore report promptly for their respective events.
14. To keep the field clear of spectators and to have the meet run under proper conditions, athletes not competing in events will keep away from the track during track events and from the field during field events. There will be ample room on the stands for all of these people.
15. Coaches must remain in the stands.
16. The price of admission to spectators is 50 cents, tax included.
17. The State Championship Track and Field Meet will be held at State College on Saturday, May 28, 1949. The classification of schools and the rules for competition are the same as those governing the District Meets. Each of the twelve districts in the State may send two teams, Class A and Class B. Each team will be made up of two representatives in each event. The District Committee, in preparing the entry blank for the State Meet, will select the contestants that finish

first and second in the various events unless notification is given by successful contestants that they cannot participate in the State Meet. In such cases the Committee will select winners of third, fourth, or fifth places in order. A relay team will be considered as a "representative" or "contestant."

18. A drawing for places in track events and for order in field events has been made by the Committee before the meet.

19. If an athlete is competing in the trials (100 or 220) he may pass his trials in broad or high jump (if entered) but he must report for these events **within three minutes** after completion of the sprints and remain at jumping pits.

20. Athletes qualifying for the State Championship Meet will report to Mr. Zimmerman their decision concerning the trip. The District will collect \$8.00 from each athlete qualifying for and making the trip to the State Championship Meet at State College; the remainder of the cost will be borne by the District. Mr. Fishburn will act as official representative of the District Committee for the State Meet. No refund will be made for athletes traveling in private cars.

21. In field events (shot, javelin, discus) every contestant will be allowed four throws in trials. The ten best performers will be given two more trials. The six best will qualify for the finals.

22. The high jump starts at five feet. The bar will be raised by two-inch intervals to six feet; by one inch above six feet. Pole vault to start at nine feet. Bars to be raised by six-inch intervals to eleven feet; by three-inch intervals above eleven feet.

23. Second place relay teams will be entered for the State Championship Meet but the District Committee will bear no further responsibility (financial or other) for transportation, housing or meals. This is due to the current economic situation.

Chester Dethroned as Dist

Norristown Is Class 'A' Victor; Darby Takes Title in Class 'B'; Wright Retains Sprint Titles

The Chester High School track team, victorious in every meet it had entered up to last Saturday, was dethroned as the District One PIAA track team champion at Upper Darby on Saturday.

The Clippers finished second to Norristown in the battle for the Class "A" honors, scoring 31 1/2 points to 41 7/20 for Norristown. Upper Darby was third with 23 1/3.

Delaware County got some consolation in the Class "B" event, however, as Darby High rolled up an amazing total of 48 points to capture the Class "B" team crown. Eddystone was second with 28 1/2 points while Swarthmore, defending champion, was third.

The Clippers actually won the most Class "A" championships when Bennie Wright repeated his triumphs in the 100 and 220-yard dashes, and the half-mile relay team of Leroy Wainwright, Art Diggs, Tom Glidca, and Wright won their event.

Blanked in Hurdles

But the Clippers were shut out in the hurdles, where they had hoped to score 6 or 7 points, and failed to count in either the javelin or discus, other events in which points were expected.

Norristown won only the javelin, taken by Al Cantello, and gained a tie for the high jump when Bob Campbell and Les Cagle, of Haverford, were deadlocked. The Eagles, however, rolled up points with seconds in both one-mile and half-mile relays, the broad jump, and shot put.

Chester also got a pair of seconds when Diggs finished runnerup to Wright in the two dash events. He will make the trip to the PIAA championships at State College next week.

Only other double winner in Class "A" was Harry Kurlish, of Ridley Township, who won the shot put and discus throw. The Raider ace failed to achieve 50 feet in the shot put but was still well ahead in his line try.

Others to State Meet

In addition to Wright, Diggs, the Chester 880 team, Cagle, and Kurlish, Delaware County has four other athletes going to State College in Class "A": Ken Ford, of Swarthmore, finished second in the discus while Upper Darby had second placers in Warren Bevan, 440; Bob Bedard, 880; and Bob Johnson, javelin.

Two Class "A" meet records were set. Len Black, of Abington, shattered the standard in the one-mile run with a 4:23 time while Dick Albright, of Landale, won the 120-yard high hurdles in record time of 1:4 seconds.

Darby High took four Class "B" titles and qualified seven individuals and a relay team for the PIAA meet in scoring the 48 points with which it won the Class "B" laurels.

Robert Rivell won the javelin for the Rams, George Carey and Bob

Guy tied in the high jump, and Cliff Green won the broad jump while the 880-yard relay team was also first.

Other Ram qualifiers for the trip upstate were Charles Pratt, second in both the 100 and 220; Charles Wilson, 200-yard low hurdles; Al Ferguson, 440.

Garnet Relay Team Wins

Swarthmore qualified its mile relay team, which was an easy winner. Gordy Pollett, who captured the 440, and Fred Campbell, second in the discus.

Eddystone's Joe Kosniak successfully defended his mile run honors in a terrific race with Jack Hayes, of Collingdale, who also goes to Penn State.

Another Collingdale athlete to make the trip is Barney Bowman, pole vaulter, who was in a three-way tie for first but who won a State College trip in a toss.

Springfield is the other Delco school to send boys to State College. John Steimer, 880, Dick Walkup, javelin, and Walt Schmidt, shot put, were each second in their respective events.

The only Class "B" double winners were Bob Felver of Morrisville, sprints, and Bob Edmiston of Hattboro, shot and discus. Edmiston set a meet record of 31 ft. 10 1/2 in. in the shot.

Kirkwood Wins Inquirer Golf With 276 Score

Hollywood's Joe Kirkwood Jr., who plays Joe Palooka in the movies, felt today that the home-nine jitters which marred his previous tournament play were a thing of the past.

And he had good reason for this belief.

The strapping blond won the Philadelphia Inquirer tournament Sunday with a 12 under par 276 which set a new course record for the Whitmarsh Valley Country Club. The victory was worth \$2600 to the film player, but he said it was worth a lot more than that to his future fame.

Kirkwood overpowered a topflight field despite a two over par 74 final round. Johnny Palmer, Badin, N. C., the defending champion, tied the course record set by Henry Cooper 12 years ago. His 290, one stroke better than his winning score last year, put him in second place.

Bobby Locke, the South African scourge of American golf purses, was third with 281. Fred Haas Jr., of New Orleans, was fourth with 282, and Lloyd Mangrum of Chicago, the leading money winner of 1949, was fifth with 283.

The confident and deliberate Kirkwood had his shaky moment in the last nine holes, a familiar story to those who followed his shortlived tournament play. Last year he was fourth in the National Open when a 43 on the last nine thudded him to 21st place. This year he was tied in the Masters, eight holes from home, and crumbled to finish seventh.

A superlative 68 during the rain-swept morning round, coming after an opening round of 68 and a course record 66 second round had sent him out four strokes ahead, gave Kirkwood a nine-stroke bulge on the field starting the final 18 holes.

He was two under par at the turn and birdied the 11th. Then it happened.

Kirkwood took seven on the par three 12th. He bogeyed the 13th and 15th and his lead over Palmer shrank to three strokes, three holes from home. Then he recovered and got a bird and two pars.

The others who finished in the first 11 places were: Jim Ferrier, San Francisco, sixth, with 285; Clayton Heafner, Charlotte, N. C., seventh, with 286; Dutch Harrison, Little Rock, Ark., eighth, with 287, and Cary Middlecott, Memphis, Tenn., Herman Kelsor, St. Andrews, Ill., and Ed Furgol, Royal Oak, Mich., all tied at 289.

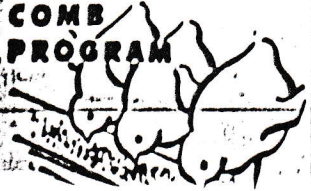
Leo Palm, of Sun Oil, led the medal scoring with a 78, while Harris, of Congoleum, was next best with an 81.
