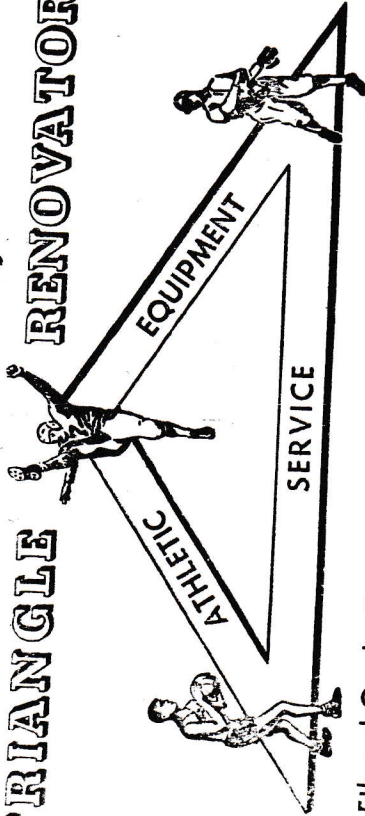

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. This District Track and Field Meet is being held under the jurisdiction of the Board of Control, P.I.A.A. All contestants must meet P.I.A.A. eligibility rules. Events, conditions, etc., are governed by National Federation of High Schools' Rules.
2. Class A schools are those whose total enrollment (boys and girls) in grades 9 to 12, inclusive, on October 1, 1954, was 500 or more; Class B schools are those with enrollments under 500 in the same grades on the same date.
3. Two participants per school is the maximum permitted in all running events and the pole vault. In other events each school may have up to three participants.
4. No contestant may participate in more than THREE events.
5. No post entries, changes in entry lists, or substitutions will be allowed.
6. There shall be no semi-finals in either track or field events. Trial heats will be necessary in certain events, but in the 440, 880, the mile, and both relays, these events will be held. If there are too many contestants for one heat in these events, they will be run against time, each main place winner being timed. The first five place winners will be determined by their time performances.
7. In the 180-yard low hurdles, the first hurdle shall be placed 20 yards from the start and the remaining hurdles at 20-yard intervals. The distance from the last hurdle to the finish shall be 20 yards.
8. In the 120-yard high hurdles for Class A, 10 hurdles, 39 inches high, will be used. The first hurdle is 15 yards from the starting line. Each of the hurdles will be 10 yards apart, leaving 15 yards between the last hurdle and the finish.
9. In all finals of running events, the times of both first and second places shall be taken and recorded.
10. In the one-mile relay for Classes A and B, each contestant shall run one-quarter of the mile. In the half-mile relay, each contestant shall run 220 yards.
11. The weights of the shot used in P.I.A.A. meets shall be 12 pounds. The discus and javelin shall conform to N.C.A.A. standards. All implements must be weighed in and inspected before the events by the officials in charge.
12. Five places will be scored in each event on a 5-4-3-2-1 basis. Gold, silver and bronze medals will be awarded to the winners of first, second and third places in each event. Trophies will be presented to the school winning the highest total number of points in each class. Medals and trophies will be distributed to winners from a stand erected on the field.
13. The preliminaries will begin at 10:00 a.m. (daylight time). Track finals will begin at 2:00 p.m. The District Committee desires the meet to be run off without unnecessary delays. Contestants will therefore report promptly for their respective events.
14. To keep the field clear of spectators and to have the meet run under proper conditions, athletes not competing in events will keep away from the track during track events and from field during field events. There will be room in the stands for these people.
15. Coaches must remain in the stands. THIS RULE WILL BE ENFORCED!
16. The price of admission to spectators is 75 cents, including a copy of this program.
17. The State Championship Track and Field Meet will be held at Pennsylvania State University on Saturday, May 28, 1955. The classification of schools and the rules for competition are the same as those governing the District Meets. Each of the twelve districts in the State may send two teams, Class

GENERAL INFORMATION (Continued)

A and Class B. Each team will be made up of two representatives in each event. The District Committee, in preparing the entry blank for the State Meet, will select the contestants that finish first and second in the various events unless notification is given by successful contestants that they cannot participate in the State Meet. In such cases the Committee will select winners of third, fourth and fifth places in order. A relay team will be considered as a "representative" or "contestant."

18. A drawing for places in track events and for order in field events has been made by the Track Committee and District Committee before the meet.
19. If an athlete is competing in the trials (100, 220, both hurdles) he may pass his trials in broad or high jump (if entered) but he must report for these events within three minutes after completion of the trials and remain at jumping pits.
20. Athletes qualifying for the State Championship Meet will report to Mr. Zimmerman their decision concerning the trip, *immediately after the event*. The District will collect \$10.00 from each athlete qualifying for and making the trip to the State Championship Meet at the State University; the remainder of the cost will be borne by the District Committee. Mr. Zimmerman will be in charge of the District One teams on the trip and at the Meet. Mr. Fishburn will act as financial representative of the District Committee for the State Meet. No refund will be made for athletes traveling in private cars.
21. In field events (shot, javelin, discus, running broad jump) every contestant will be allowed four trials. The six best will qualify for the finals, with three trials each.
22. Coaches and winners in the pole vault will note that at the State Championship Meet at State University on May 28, the runway for the pole vault will be *hard surfaced*.
23. The high jump starts at five feet. The bar will be raised by two-inch intervals to five feet, six inches. During this period, a *total* of three misses accumulated by a contestant will disqualify him. The bar will then continue to be raised by two-inch intervals to six feet and at one-inch intervals above six feet, but each contestant will have three trials at *each* height before disqualification.
24. The pole vault will start at nine feet. The bar will be raised by six-inch intervals to ten feet, six inches. During this period, a *total* of three misses accumulated by a contestant will disqualify him. The bar will then be raised by three-inch intervals, but each contestant will have three trials at *each* height before disqualification.
25. Second place relay teams will be entered for the State Championship Meet, but the District Committee will bear no further responsibility (financial or other) for the transportation, housing or meals.
26. Starting blocks may be used when available.

Ideas about soil water are often vague, and likely to confuse the action of water in a lake or pond with that applied to the soil. There are few points of resemblance. Water applied to the soil does not seek its own level. If the soil is dry, the soil particles attract water to themselves and hold it against the pull of gravity. Not until the water holding capacity of the top soil particles has been filled can additional water and its way to lower levels. There is never a substantial lateral movement of water in the soil. If sufficient water is applied to dry soil to wet it to a depth of say 4 inches, the soil below that will remain dry, and the top soil will dry from the top down. Root growth cannot be active below

Young Breaks Mark In PIAA 180 Hurdles

NORRISTOWN, Pa., May 21.—Walt Young, Hatboro Horsham High School's State champion, set the meet's lone record today as Lower Merion and Swarthmore dominated the action to win their class titles in the 29th annual District 1 PIAA championship at Roosevelt Field.

Lower Merion, which won the Suburban Conference title on the same field a week ago, pled up 47 5/6 points to sweep Class A. Norristown was second with 33 5/6 and Springfield (Delco) third with 25.
