procedure will be followed in making up both the Class A and Class B District teams.

14. Athletes qualifying for the State Meet must be reported by their coaches to Mr. Kauler, Chairman of the Track Committee, and the Chief Scorer, concerning their decision to take part in the State Meet, IMMEDIATELY after the event. The costs of contestants to the State Meet will be borne by the District Committee. Mr. Kauler will be in charge of the District One teams on the trip and at the State Meet. Contestants may not travel to or from the State Meet in private cars without having obtained permission from Mr. Kauler. Such permission is required for athletes to be permitted to represent District One in the State Meet.
15. If an athlete is competing in the trials (100, 220, both hurdle races) he may pass his trials in the field events (if entered) but he must report for these events within three minutes after completion of the trials and remain at the site of the field event(s). He must report to the field event(s) for the remaining trials before the completion of the trials and the start of the finals in these field events.
16. In all competition, both track and field, jerseys must be worn inside trunks, no caps, tams, or long stockings may be worn, and all relay team contestants must wear the same uniforms.

B. Track Events

1. Minimum qualifying standards for track events:

2. The preliminaries will begin at 9:30 A.M. (Daylight Time). Track finals will begin at 2:00 P.M. (Daylight Time). The District Committee desires the meet to be run off without unnecessary delays. Contestants will therefore report promptly for their respective events.
3. There will be no semi-finals in either track or field events. Trial heats will be necessary in some events, but in the 440, 880, one-mile, the two-mile, and all three relays, only finals will be held. If there are too many contestants for one final in these events, two or more sections will be run against time, each main place winner being timed. The first five place winners will be determined by their time performances.
4. In the 180-Yard Low Hurdles, the first hurdle shall be placed 20 yards from the start and the remaining hurdles at 20-yard intervals. The distance from the last hurdle to the finish line shall be 20 yards.
5. In the 120-Yard High Hurdles, 10 hurdles, 39 inches high, will be used. The first hurdle is 15 yards from the starting line. Each of the hurdles will be 10 yards apart, leaving 15 yards between the last hurdle and the finish line.
6. In all finals of running events, the times of first, second and third places shall be taken and recorded.
7. In the 880-Yard Relays for Classes A and B, each contestant shall run 220 yards. In the One-Mile Relays for Classes A and B, each contestant shall run one quarter of the mile. In the Two-Mile Relay for Classes A and B, each contestant shall run one-half of a mile.
8. Both first and second place relay teams in Class A and Class B will be taken to the State Meet by the District. Both first and second place relay teams, in Class A and Class B, will receive the same financial support from the District as any first and second place winners in other events.

INFORMATION

A. General

1. This District Track and Field Championship Meet is being conducted by the District Committee under the jurisdiction of the Board of Control, P.I.A.A. All contestants must meet P.I.A.A. eligibility rules. Events, conditions, etc., are governed by the National Federation High School rules, with such variations as have been established by the Board of Control, and the Official P.I.A.A. Rules and Regulations Governing Interscholastic Sports Competition.
2. Class A schools are those whose total enrollments (boys and girls) in grades 10 to 12, inclusive, on October 31, 1967, were 800 or more; Class B schools are those with enrollments under 800 in the same grades on the same date.
3. Participants in the District Meet must meet published minimum qualifying standards. Only boys will compete in this meet whose names have been submitted on "Participants Forms" on the basis of having met the minimum standards in prior meets. Continued failure to meet these standards will result in the District Committee being requested to bar offending schools from the District Meet.
4. Should any boy whose name is not on the school entry list, in the program, and on the "Participants Form," compete in any event; should any boy not named on the school entry list, the program, and the "Participants Form," use the name or number of a contestant whose name is on the school entry list, the program and the "Participants Form," and compete in any event:
 - a) all points scored in the meet by the school from which the boy who is in violation comes, may be cancelled;
 - b) all medals won in the meet by the school from which the boy who is in violation comes, may be forfeited;
 - c) all entries from the school from which the boy who is in violation comes, may be disbarred from the State Meet;
 - d) the school from which the boy who is in violation comes, may be disbarred from the District Meet the following year.
5. Two participants per school is the maximum permitted in all events except the relays.
6. No contestant may participate in more than three events, exclusive of the two-mile run. Participants in the two-mile run may not compete in any other event.
7. No post entries, changes in entry lists or Participants Forms, or substitutions, are allowed.
8. Five places will be scored in each event on a 6-4-3-2-1 basis. Gold, silver, and bronze medals will be awarded to the winners of first, second, third, fourth and fifth places in each event. Trophies will be awarded to the schools winning the highest total number of points, one to each class. Medals and trophies will be distributed to the winners after each event and at the end of the meet.
9. To keep the field clear of spectators and to have the meet run under proper conditions, athletes not competing in events will keep away from the track during track events and from the field during field events. There will be room in the stands and rest quarters for these people.
10. Coaches MUST remain in the stands.
11. The price of admission to spectators is \$1.00, including a copy of this program.
12. Seeding for track events and the order of competition in field events were done before the meet.
13. The State Championship Track and Field Meet will be held at Pennsylvania State University on Saturday, May 24, 1969. The classification of schools and the rules for competition are the same as those governing the District Meets. Each of the twelve districts in the Commonwealth may send two teams, Class A and Class B. Each team will be made up of two representatives in each event. In preparing the entry blank for the State Meet, the District Committee will select the contestants that finish first and second in the various events unless notification is given by successful contestants that they will not participate in the State Meet. In such cases the District Committee will select winners of third, fourth and fifth places in order. A relay team will be considered as a "representative" or "contestant." This

INFORMATION (Continued)

9. Claims for National and District records in sprint events and hurdles events, will be accepted only when information about wind velocities can be furnished. A wind gauge will be used in these events in District Meets. A wind velocity of less than 4.473 miles per hour favoring the runner is required for an application to receive favorable consideration.

C. Field Events

1. Minimum qualifying standards for field events:

2. In the field events, no entries are permitted after the judge starts competition.

3. In all field events, a contestant shall be charged with an unsuccessful attempt if he does not complete his trial or indicate his passing it, within TWO MINUTES after he has been called for a trial.

4. In the field events (shot put, discus throw, javelin throw, long jump and triple jump), every contestant will be allowed four trials. Immediately afterward, the six best will qualify for the finals with three trials each.

5. For District and State Championship Meets, in the event of ties, points and places will be decided according to Section 2, Rule 5, of the National Alliance Edition of Track and Field Rules.

6. The weight of the shot used in P.I.A.A. meets shall be 12 pounds. The discus and javelin shall conform to N.C.A.A. standards. Shot and disci used in this meet are those belonging to the District Committee. Javelins must be weighed in and inspected before the event by the officials in charge of implement inspection.

7. At Norristown, hard surfaces are used for jumping events, shot and discus throws, pole vault, triple and long jumps. Rubber-soled shoes and shoes with pin spikes will be permitted—no others!

8. Coaches and winners in the shot put, discus throw, high jump, long jump, triple jump, pole vault, will note that at the State Championship Meet the surfaces will be hard-surfaced. No spikes will be permitted on the shot and discus circles. Rubber-soled shoes must be worn for these events. Also, the running track is made of composition material, thereby requiring the use of shoes with spikes no longer than one-quarter inch.

Note:—At the State Meet, the shot and disci for competition will be furnished by the P.I.A.A. School-owned implements in these events may be used only in practice.

9. In the high jump, the bar will be raised by two-inch intervals to six feet; by one-inch intervals above six feet. Three consecutive misses will disqualify a contestant.

10. In the Class B pole vault the bar will be raised by six-inch intervals to eleven feet; by three-inch intervals above eleven feet; by two-inch intervals above twelve feet. A total of three consecutive misses will disqualify a contestant.

11. In the Class A pole vault, the bar will be raised by three-inch intervals to twelve feet; by two-inch intervals above twelve feet. A total of three consecutive misses will disqualify a contestant.

12. If weather conditions or district performances prior to the District Meet require it, changes in starting and interval heights will be decided upon at the beginning of the meet.

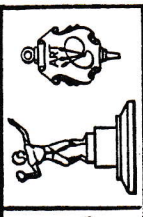

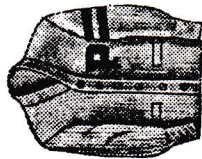

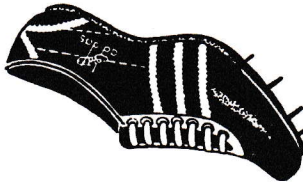

North Penn, Bristol Capture Track Crowns

PIAA Dist. 1 Meet 5/17/1969 at Pennsbury HS

A change in site and a spectacular stadium had absolutely no effect upon District One's record-busting trackmen yesterday.

Forced to move from Norristown's Roosevelt Field to "closed" Pennsbury High's field in Fairless Hills by spectator violence the week before, local high school cindersmen responded by setting six new records.

North Penn, sparked by sprinter Bill Clugston's two firsts (100 and 220) and a second (440), dethroned Coatesville as the Class A champion, while Gene White's triple led Bristol to the Class B title.

The first two finishers in each

event won the right to compete in Saturday's Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic Association championships at Penn State.

North Penn, perennial Buxmont League champion, needed Clugston's heroics to hold off Abington, which finished second with 31 points despite a pair of record-breaking performances by its 880 and mile relay teams.

Clugston, the defending state Class A 220-yard titlist, won his specialty in 21.9 after his 9.7 timing for the 100 was not recognized for a record because of the prevailing wind velocity. He finished second to

Abington's Bill Neely in the 440.

Two Relay Records

Neely ran on both of the Ghosts' record-setting relay teams. Neely was joined by Randy Barnes, Bill Stephans and Keith Johnson on the 880 quartet which was timed in 1:29.9, one-tenth of a second faster than Lower Merion's clocking in 1966.

Tony Madden subbed for Stephans in the mile, but Abington came through with a 3:22.9 clocking, again a tenth of a second better than the previous mark set by the Ghosts last year.

The other Class A standard to fall was in the day's final event—the pole vault. West Chester's Dick Yates cleared 13 feet, 4 1/2 inches to surpass the former mark of North Penn's Howie Davis in 1966 by three inches.

White climaxed a brilliant day by producing a 44 foot, 8 1/4 inch triple jump to help Bristol accumulate 38 points. White's other winning distances were 22 feet, 7 1/2 inches for the long jump and 6 feet, 6 inches for the high jump.

Freda Sets 40 Mark

Sharon Hill's Don Freda sped to a 50.3 clocking in the 440 when the wind wasn't blowing and it was recognized as a new Class B mark.

The third Class B record was by Lower Moreland double-winner Ty Higgins, who threw the discus 167 feet, 6 inches. He won the shot with a heave of 48 feet, 8 1/2 inches.

Three other double winners joined Clugston and Higgins. Chester's Bruce Collins won both the Class A high and low hurdle events. Interboro's Ken Thomson took both the long and triple jumps in Class A, and Unionville sprinter Ron Miller captured the Class B 100 and 200-yard dashes.
