PROCEDURE FOR AA DISTRICT 1 TOURNAMENT

1. Weigh-in Saturday, 8:00 AM (scales will be opened for unofficial weight checks at 7:30-7:55)
 - **The Head Official will be assigned do skin checks. Any wrestlers with a skin issue MUST have a valid note at beginning of weigh-in. Hired onsite Doctor will have final say on eligibility.**
2. First Session (Quarter-Finals)
 - Wrestling begins at 9:00 AM on two mats.
 - **The District Committee voted to allow wrestling to be a one session tournament this year. Wrestling will begin at 9 Am and go to conclusion with short breaks before the Semi Finals and Finals**
3. First Session Continued (Semi-Final, Wrestle back Quarter-Finals and Semi-Final Consolation Rounds)
 - Semi-Final round will be wrestled on the first available mat using two mats. Attempting to avoid two wrestlers from the same school at the same time.
 - Mandatory 15-minute break for scorers, timers, and officials before Semi-Finals start.
 - First Round Wrestle backs, two or three mats, after the completion of the Semi-Final round. The second round of wrestle backs will be wrestled on three mats if possible after the first round of wrestle backs are completed.
4. Second Session: (Championship and Consolation Finals)^{***}**This is only when a full day of competition is required**
 - *Championship and Consolation Finals wrestling is to begin at 6:00 p.m. by weight class on alternate mats. The Parade of Champions is to begin no later then 5:45 p.m.*
 - *Circumstances may require a change from alternating mats. The Tournament Manager, Steering Committee Representative and Head Referee will make the decision.*
 - *An additional round may be necessary after the championship and consolation finals to determine the "True Second". The loser of each final bout vs. the winner of the consolation final bout will compete for the "true second place" provided that the two have not previously met in this tournament. These matches will be wrestled on two mats.*
5. Officials
 - TBD but at least five officials with one official being designated as the Head official. Officials must fill out PIAA worksheet with Social Security number.
6. Official's Duties
 - The referee will follow tournament rules published in the National Federation Rules Book.
 - The referees cannot make changes in the seeding.
 - Mat Judges will be used for Semis, Finals and Consi Finals
7. Timers and Scorers
 - All Day - one timer and one scorer on each mat.
 - Timers must remember that consolation bouts are 1-2-2 minutes in length.
 - Responsible adults should be considered for this job.
8. Ticket Sellers/Ticket Takers
 - Please try to keep the number of workers to a minimum.
 - Ticket to enter is \$10^{***}
9. Announcer-Clerk
 - Will be present for the entire tournament.
10. Matchmaker / computer/ charts/ scoring
11. Tournament Manager

12. Steering Committee Tournament Supervisor:
 - One supervisor will be assigned for each tournament for the purpose of directing all weigh-ins scheduled by the tournament director and to assist the tournament director as needed. The supervisor will sign off on all expenses and must agree that they are in contractual agreement. The supervisor must also meet with the tournament director prior to the tournament to discuss fees.
 - **The host school will provide at least two certified scales for weigh-ins; DIGITAL SCALES ARE REQUIRED**
13. A Physician should be in attendance at all sessions. Be certain to provide at least a trainer and have available emergency ambulance service for all sessions where a doctor is not available. The Athletic Trainer appropriated by the host school is the only one permitted in and on the mat area. Individual school trainers may work with their athletes out of the mat area only.
14. Police will be paid accordingly to the school district policy. The fees must be approved by tournament supervisor.
15. Refreshment cost must not exceed \$125.00. . Receipts must be included in financial report.
16. Consolations
 - Consolation finalists will be determined by the wrestle back procedure.
 - Periods are 1-2-2 minutes in length.
17. At the end of each period of each bout a person will tap the referee on the back to let the referee know that the period is over. This person should not tap the referee if there is no action, but should be ready if the referee does not end the bout.
18. Passes: (NO LEAGUE PASSES WILL BE HONORED)
 - The following passes will be honored at all tournaments:
 - District One complimentary passes
 - Wrestling Steering Committee passes
 - Working Press passes
 - College Wrestling Coaches with Credentials
19. Complimentary Tickets
 - Seven (7) tickets for Regional Tournament will be given to each school for use by team coaches, managers, and administrators. These tickets will be distributed at the seeding meeting. Only contestants will be stamped at the time of weigh-ins for admission.
20. Seeding:
 - The District Seeding Meeting will be conducted on Wednesday, February 19 2015.
 - The AA Coaches will seed their wrestlers.
 - The meeting will be held at the host school
21. District Team Champion:
 - A running team score will be kept at the head table.
 - The procedure is included in this manual under the Sectional section.
 - At the end of the tournament the school with the highest number of points will be declared the champion.
 - Points do not carry over to the Regional Tournament.
22. Awards:
 - Medals will be awarded to the first two (2) places. A team plaque will be awarded to the Team Champion.
23. Outstanding Wrestler Award:
 - Is provided by the District 1 Wrestling Coaches Association. District 1 Steering Committee member assigned to seeding meeting will handle this responsibility.

24. Regional Tournament:
 - District 1 "AA" will advance two (3) wrestlers in each weight class to the Regional Tournament.
25. Payment of Workers:
 - As per instructions at the Tournament Managers Meeting.
26. Broadcasting and Television fees for each tournament. Refer to Mr. Sean Kelly, Assistant Executive Secretary District 1 PIAA, (610) 519-9525.
27. Bracket Format: See Attachments
28. The Tournament Supervisor and the Tournament Director, have the right to alter the wrestling times as necessary.
29. 3 Wrestlers will advance to the Regional at Wilson HS The tournament Director is Gerald Schwille AD at Northern HS 1-717-432-8691 x 2014
30. All Champions are to gather at the conclusion of the Tournament to allow a photo opportunity for schools and fans.

CRITERIA FOR DETERMINING TEAM CHAMPION OF EACH TOURNAMENT

Section 2: **Team Scoring** (pages 33-35 in NF High School Wrestling Rules Book)

Art. 2: **In Tournaments**, individual placement points shall be awarded as soon as earned. Placement points already earned will be deducted in case of forfeit (other than injury) or disqualification from the tournament.

Points for team scoring will be awarded as follows:

- a. **Two (2) team advancement points** shall be scored for each match won in the championship bracket, except for the final first place match. If a wrestler receives a bye in the first round, he shall be awarded 2 advancement points for that round if he wins his next match. No points are awarded for the bye if the wrestler loses his next match;
- b. **One (1) team advancement point** will be scored for each match won in the consolation elimination, except for the final third and fifth place matches. A wrestler who has a bye in the consolation round shall receive one advancement point, provided he wins his next round match;
- c. **Two (2) additional points** shall be scored for each match won by default, disqualification, fall, or forfeit throughout the tournament.
- d. **1 1/2 additional points** will be scored for each match won by a technical fall.
- e. **One (1) additional point** shall be awarded for each match won by a major decision.
- f. **In tournament scoring four (4) places** (and wrestling extra matches to determine a "true second", the winner of each championship semi-final shall be awarded seven (7) place points and the winner of each championship final shall be awarded seven (7) additional place points. The winner of each consolation semi-final shall receive four (4) place points and the winner of third place shall receive three (3) additional place points. When the true second is determined three (3) additional team points shall be added to his score.

DISTRICT I LEAGUE/AA SEEDING PROCEDURE

District Seeding – All coaches will send their entries in weight classes with seeding points to Chris Lloyd and the seeding will be assigned by him

TO ALL COACHES: Read the following seeding information and come to the meeting with a complete win-loss record for each contestant and **a copy for each team in your section**. You must also bring a copy of your schools Eligibility Sheet with coaches names included. This information shall be recorded on the Win-Loss Record sheets. Be prepared to confirm each record with your scorebooks. The seeding meeting is under the supervision of the Steering Committee member assigned. No section may add or delete rules for seeding.

1. **All wrestlers are to be seeded. The wrestler entered at the seeding meeting is the entry for that weight class. A wrestler cannot change weight classes after being seeded. A forfeit entered at the seeding meeting will remain as a forfeit. Any injured or ill wrestler may be replaced up prior to the beginning of weigh-in**
2. A wrestler moving up two or more weight classes from the weight at which he wrestled 50% of his matches for tournaments may not be seeded above 4th regardless of points.
3. If points are exactly the same, the higher seed will be based on the following criteria:
 - (a) Competition with each other;
 - (b) Returning sectional, district, regional or state champion in not more than two weight classes above where he wrestled last season;
 - (c) Common opponents;
 - (d) Number of falls, forfeits and defaults;
 - (e) Tech falls;
 - (f) Draw-sticks correctly numbered with available seeds.

Seeding will be determined by a point system. Points will be awarded for:

Criterion 1 – Percentage Record for varsity bouts- One point for a win and divide point total by number of bouts

Example 1 15-5 15 divided by 20= 75

Example 2 12-17 12 div. by 29 = 41

Must have a minimum of 18 bouts to receive full Points... If not, subtract 5 points per match under 18

Example 3 9-7-- 9div by 16= 56 then subtract 10= 46 TOTAL

Criterion 2 - Prestige Points

- Points awarded for highest place earned in last year's post-season tournament. (i.e. Sectional Champ and District 6th place, he gets credit for being a district 6th, 9 pts.)
- If wrestler is coming from out of state or private school, his information for where he placed in his post-season tournament must be sent to District 1 Wrestling Chairman to determine his prestige points from previous year.

Criterion 3 – Caliber of Competition

Points will be awarded for competition against last years medal winners in Pa Regional and Districts.

Caliber points must earned in a match not a forfeit.

Post Season Seeding

Criteria #1 – Percentage record of this season’s varsity bouts – won/loss record

Points: 1 point for win

Divide: Points scored by total bouts

Example 1: record 15 wins – 5 losses $15/20 = 0.75$ or 75pts

Example 2: record 12 wins – 17 losses $12/29 = 0.41$ or 41pts

Must have a minimum 18 bouts to get full points... If not, subtract 5 points for each bout under 18

Example 3: record 10 wins – 4 losses $10/14 = 71 - 20 = 51$

Note: Always round out to two decimal points

Criteria #2 – Prestige points (awards bonus points for wrestler’s previous year)

4. Bye system. When byes are required for the first round, they shall be placed by mutual consent or drawn so they are distributed evenly throughout the bracket. No quarter-bracket or half-bracket shall have more than one bye in excess of its paired bracket.
5. Order of bracket numbers from top to bottom. **CHAMPIONSHIP WALL BRACKETS WILL BE PROVIDED BY D1**

6. When a wrestler is removed from the tournament after the seeding meeting:
 - A. The weight class is re-seeded.
 - B. Wrestlers Receiving Exceptional Seeding Criteria can be used.
 - C. A wrestler who steps on the scale during the official Weigh-in time may not be replaced.
 - D. If a school changes classification AA-AAA, points earned from the previous year's tournament are used for seeding.
 7. No wrestler may move to a different weight class after the weight class has been seeded.
 8. At the seeding meeting, each coach will be given his school's allotment of complimentary passes.
 9. In the Sectional tournament, the Semi-Final loser will cross-bracket into the consolation bracket.
- NO LEAGUE OR OTHER PASSES WILL BE HONORED FOR DISTRICT TOURNAMENTS.
 - District 1 Pass shall be accepted.

Optimal Performance Calculator Instructions for District I Coaches

Instructions for preparing District I seeding forms

Select Weight Class and Prestige of wrestlers competing in Post-Season

1. Login to the OPC system and go to the competition entry screens (Page where you enter results).
2. Click on link that says select wrestlers for post-season competition
3. List of wrestlers will appear.
4. Click on the names of the wrestlers that will appear in the post season in the column titled will compete in post-season.
5. On the drop down menu, enter the weight class the wrestler will be competing at the district tournament.
6. From the drop down menu, select if the wrestler is a returning place finisher from last year. The prestige points for the wrestler will automatically calculate.
7. After making the selections, click on the save choices button at the top of the page.

How to view and update the Individual Season Wrestling Record Form to Complete Seeding Form

1. Click on the individual season wrestling record form link.
2. A list of wrestlers for your institution will appear.
3. Click on the wrestler's season record form you would like to view.
4. After clicking on the wrestler, you will be taken to a grid page of all the wrestler's matches entered for the year.
5. You can view the data and ensure what wrestler's should appear on the season record form and be submitted to your qualifying tournaments.
6. Unclick any match (non-varsity matches) that does not meet the criteria to appear on your state's season record form.
7. Matches that were in the district or state duals should be clicked in the district/state dual column. This is important step so that the system does not calculate these matches.
8. After updating the season record form, click on the save choices button at the top of the page.
9. **DO NOT CLICK ON THE SEASON RECORD FORM AT THE TOP. OF THE PAGE. THIS IS NOT THE CORRECT SEASON RECORD FORM FOR DISTRICT I**

CRITERIA FOR DETERMINING TEAM CHAMPION OF EACH TOURNAMENT

SECTION 2. Team Scoring

Art. 2. In tournaments, individual placement points shall be awarded as soon as earned. Placement points already earned will be deducted in case of forfeit (other than injury) or disqualification. Points for team scoring will be awarded as follows:

- (a) Two team advancement points shall be scored for each match won in the championship bracket except for the final first place match. **(Every man is seeded thus Pigtales will be scored immediately when they advance into the quarterfinals.)**
- (b) One team advancement point will be scored for each match won in the consolation elimination except for the final third and fifth place matches.
- (c) Two additional points will be scored for each match won by default, disqualification, fall, or forfeit throughout the tournament. A team not entering a contestant will be considered a bye in the bracket.
- (d) Technical fall - 1 1/2 points.
- (e) One point awarded for each match won by a major decision.
- (f) In tournament scoring 4 places, the winner of each championship semi-final shall be awarded 10 place points and the winner of each championship final shall be awarded 4 additional place points. The winner of each consolation semi-final shall receive 4 place points and the winner of 3rd place shall receive 3 additional place points.
- (g) In tournaments scoring 6 places, the winner of each championship quarter-final shall be awarded 3 place points, the winner of each championship semi-final shall be awarded 9 additional place points and the winner of each championship final shall be awarded 4 additional place points. The winner of the quarterfinal consolation match shall receive 3 place points. The winner of the consolation semi-finals shall receive 4 additional place points. The winner of 3rd place and the winner of 5th place shall receive 2 additional place points.
