Schools in PIAA are in a crisis mode for lack of officials. All are asked to help recruit and retain officials. All schools are asked to hold coaches and athletes accountable when dealing with the treatment of officials and disqualifications. Please note the Supplemental Disqualification Rule which requires a 2-game sit out and the completion of the NHFS Sportsmanship program.

Schools are asked to properly fill out Transfer Forms, not parents or students. Forms must be complete and accurate. It is preferred these forms are typed.

Eligibility Lists are due two weeks after the first contest.

Schools are reminded that Post-Season Waiver forms must be submitted 30 days before is the submission deadlines.

Administrators were asked to make sure PIAA Officials had proper security before and after games. Schools were encouraged to develop game management and emergency action plans for their indoor and outdoor contests. These plans should be shared with visiting schools and officials.

1. Thank you for your participation and anticipating a great school year and sports seasons. Please consider hosting district and inter-district contests at your schools this school year. Your assistance would be greatly appreciated.

2. 2022-23 mandatory practice changes to 10 days.

5 days before 1st scrimmage – scrimmages (2) may be held throughout the regular sport season. 10 practice days before 1st contest

PIAA ACTION ITEMS -- FIRST READING

6. Designation of Enrollment Classifications -

Enrollment figures shall include all Cyber Charter School and Home-Schooled Students; all students attending an Alternative School, a Magnet School, or a Vocational-Technical school; and all students attending a Charter School who are eligible at a school in the school district of their residences. 10% of the total number of these students will be added to those students who are regularly enrolled and in attendance to complete each school's classification numbers.

- 7. Discussion of the **8-semester rule** and a possible change to 10 or 12 semesters without any addition to the number of seasons of participation.
 - a. 8 semesters 9th grade 4 seasons
 - b. 10 semesters 8th grade 5 seasons
 - c. 12 semesters 7th grade 6 seasons
- 8. **Competition formula** all **Team sports** based on earning success points and removing transfers.

A team's competition classification will be determined by sport and gender using the following formula. Except as discussed herein, both enrollment numbers and success will be utilized to determine the competition classification.

Team's Most Recent Classification + Success Points = Competition Classification.

#1 – Team's Most Recent Classification

Teams will be classified by enrollment of grades 9-10-11 in the odd numbered calendar years by sport and by gender or by the competition classification formula, including voluntary upgrades.

#2 – Success Points

All teams will be assigned success points in the PIAA Inter-District Championship tournaments during the most recent two-year cycle as follows: One (1) point to a team if it qualifies to participate in an entry level inter-district championship Contest.

Total of two (2) points to a team if it qualifies to participate in a quarter-final inter-district Contest.

Total of three (3) points to a team if it qualifies to participate in a semi-final inter-district Contest.

Total of four (4) points will be awarded to the team if it qualifies to participate in a final inter-district Contest.

Application of Success Points:

A. Team awarded 6 or more Success Points for the most recent two-year cycle; team will automatically move up 1 classification for the next classification cycle regardless of that school's enrollment numbers.

B. If a team that, for the most recent two-year cycle, participated under this policy in a higher classification than its enrollment would otherwise have justified, obtains 3, 4 or 5 cumulative Success Points in that most recent two-year cycle,

Application of Success Points (cont.):

- C. the team will remain in that higher competition classification for the next two-year cycle, regardless of its enrollment (unless it voluntarily opts to move up a classification or its enrollment numbers alone mandate moving up a classification).
- D. If a team that, for the most recent two-year cycle, participated under this policy in a higher classification than its enrollment would otherwise have justified, and obtains 2 or fewer cumulative Success Points in that most recent two-year cycle, the team's competition classification will be 1 classification lower than the team's most recent two-year cycle.
- 9. Name, Image, Likeness (NIL) language to protect students and their schools. Name, Image, and Likeness. Students may receive Consideration for the use of their own name, image, and likeness (NIL). Such permissible activities include commercial endorsements, promotional activities, social media presence, product or service advertisements, and unique digital items/assets. No school or anyone employed by or affiliated with a member school, including booster clubs, coaches, administrators, and alumni, may solicit, arrange, negotiate, or pay for a student's use of their NIL and/or the provision of Consideration to a student for the use of their NIL.

In engaging in NIL activities, students may not make any reference to PIAA or a PIAA member school (including the school and/or team name, nicknames, terms by which a school or team is commonly referred or identified, logo) and may not wear school uniforms or school-identifying apparel or items). Students may not endorse or promote any third-party entities, goods, or services during team/school activities. Students may not wear the apparel or display the logo, insignia, or identifying mark of an NIL partner during any team/school athletic activities unless it is part of the standard school uniform for that sport. Students may not engage in any NIL activities involving, displaying, or endorsing the following categories of products and services:

(1) Adult entertainment products and services; (2) Alcohol products; (3) Controlled substances; (4) Opioids; (5) Casinos and gambling, including sports betting, the lottery, and betting in connection with video games, on-line games, and mobile devices; and/or (6) Weapons, firearms, and ammunition.
