Dick Belyea Runs Fastest Half Mile in Pennsylvania Schoolboy History

By WYC JUSTIS WEST CHESTER, Pa., May 22 .-Thirteen records were broken and another equaled this afternoon on Wayne Field as Norristown outscored last vent's Class A champion, Lower Merion, and Ridley Park replaced the 1936 Class B king, Prospect Park, in the P. I. A. A. District One track and field title meet.

The most sensational recordshattering performance was turned in by Dick Belyea. The Upper Darby High School junior won the halfmile in 1.57.4, the fastest time ever run by a schoolboy in this State.

In the high jump, Bob Burnett, a Media Negro, leaped 6 feet, 2 inches to set a new record. Lansdowne's unbesten speed king, Fred Wetzel. son the 100-yard dash in 10 seconds to equal the old mark. But his work and that of Belyea and Burnett could not keep Norristown, which snared two firsts, from winning the Class A crown.

The Eagles tallied 41 1/2 points. The other scorers were Lower Merion, 39; Upper Darby, 24; West Chester, 19; Lansdowne, 18; Lansdale, 17; Abington, 13'z: Conshohocken, 12; Chester, 6: Haverford, 6; Cheltenham, 4, and Coatesville, 2.

Ridley Park, the recently crowned Delaware county champion, had little rouble winning the Class B title. It won four firsts and collected 43 points.
