"I won, but I wasn't really happy with my shot put," said Vaughn, a junior. "I injured myself yesterday (Thursday) in practice. I got hit in the leg with a shot put.

"Now, I have a big bruise on my right calf. It hurt when I was throwing. Plus, I was nervous because I didn't know how good the other girls in the meet could throw.

Ottaviano surely would have been the favorite to repeat as district titilist in the Class AA javelin. Instead, he arrived for this year's district meet as a big question mark.

Ottaviano erased the question mark and replaced it with an ex-clamation point. The Pius X senior successfully defended his crown

successing defended his crown with a winning throw of 164-0.
"After blowing my knee out last fall, getting a 164-0 now is pretty good," said Ottaviano. "I was district champ last year at 166-10. I was only two feet off that today with a bad leg.
"It's been a frustrating year. I

had to have total reconstruction of my knee. After surgery, the doctors told me no football or basketball

and maybe no track.

"I busted my butt with rehab and it paid off. I went to rehab every day for two hours a day — doing everything I could to get my leg strong again. It was a real hard time. People didn't expect me to come back the way I did.

"The past four or five days it's been giving me a lot of trouble. I didn't practice because of the pain. I didn't let it bother me today. I let


